Objectives	• To provide students with practical exposure to pharmaceutical manufacturing operations. • To familiarize students with various departments of a modern pharmaceutical manufacturing unit. • To enhance students' knowledge regarding regulatory requirements, quality systems, and industrial work culture.
Description	D. Y. Patil College of Pharmacy, Kolhapur organized a one-day industrial visit to Sanofi Pharmaceuticals, Verna, Goa on 09th May 2026. A total of 35 students accompanied by 04 faculty members participated in the visit with the objective of gaining practical exposure to pharmaceutical manufacturing and quality management systems. All the participants departed from Kolhapur at 4:00 a.m. and reached Sanofi Pharmaceuticals, Verna, Goa at 12:20 p.m. Upon arrival, the group was warmly welcomed by the company's HR and technical team. The students were briefed about the company's history, manufacturing capabilities, product portfolio, safety regulations, and standard operating procedures to be followed during the industrial visit. The students were then taken on a guided tour of various departments including the Quality Assurance (QA), Quality Control (QC), Production, Packing, Regulatory Affairs (RA), and Research & Development (R&D) departments. The technical experts explained the workflow, responsibilities, and quality systems implemented in each department, providing students with valuable practical insights into pharmaceutical manufacturing operations. During the visit, students developed a comprehensive understanding of several important pharmaceutical concepts such as Good Manufacturing Practices

	(GMP), Good Documentation Practices (GDP), equipment calibration, process validation, equipment qualification, documentation systems, quality control procedures, regulatory compliance, and quality assurance activities. The industrial experts also highlighted the importance of maintaining product quality, patient safety, data integrity, and regulatory compliance throughout the manufacturing process. The students observed modern manufacturing facilities, advanced analytical instruments, automated production and packaging lines, documentation practices, and stringent quality control measures followed by the company. This exposure helped them correlate classroom learning with real-time industrial applications. After successfully completing the industrial visit and interaction session, the team expressed sincere gratitude to the management and staff of Sanofi Pharmaceuticals for their warm hospitality and valuable guidance. The group departed from the company premises at 4:00 p.m. with enhanced practical knowledge and memorable learning experiences.
